In all this the main objects desired are, that the poor may have labor, that money may be kept in the country, and that all the people, without distinction, may have among them, on a just principle, the profits arising from the transaction of their own busines; this accom-plished would be at least a step in the right direction. There is, however, an impression prevailing that home industries will not pay.
