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## PLANKS FOR "AMERICAN" PLATFORM

**LITTLEFIELD LIQUOR BILL**  
Republican Members of Judiciary Committee Exonerate Speaker Cannon From Blame for Its Defeat.

Chicago, Oct. 29.—The Tribune this morning says in a news article: "The Republican members of the house committee on judiciary in the Fifty-ninth Congress have exonerated Speaker Cannon from all blame in connection with the defeat of the Littlefield liquor bill. This was the measure which prohibited the shipment of liquor into prohibition districts. It was killed by the judiciary committee on the ground that it should pass the courts would hold it unconstitutional. "The six members addressed as well as four Republican members who did not receive any message, immediately replied, supporting the Littlefield statement in full and declaring Cannon had nothing whatever to do with the fate of the bill."

"The Tribune article adds that the Central Christian Advocate has not printed the replies from the congressmen."

**"BIG STEVE" ARRESTED.**  
Seattle, Wash., Oct. 28.—Seth B. Stevens, known to customs officers throughout Puget Sound districts as "Big Steve" and "Big Seth," was arrested in Seattle yesterday as a fugitive from justice. In 1905 Stevens and his wife, with George Berger, who at that time was local superintendent of the Pullman Car company, were arrested on a charge of smuggling opium into this country from British Columbia.

Stevens and his wife forfeited cash bail of \$120 at that time. Berger was subsequently acquitted. Stevens' wife died in Vancouver about two years ago.

During the three years that have elapsed since his arrest, Stevens has made overtures to the United States government for permission to return to the United States and assist the local customs officers in their efforts to stamp out smuggling and smugglers in this district, but his overtures were rejected.
