THE RACE TRACK.

Rechercher Record Still the Lowest.

NEW YORK, 19.—The Spirit of the

Times says: Orrin A. Hickox offers

to match St. Julian against any

trooper or pacer in the world, mile

heat, best three in five, for from

\$5,000 to \$20,000.

The Times adds: Unless this

challenge is accepted, we fear there is little

chance for a race.

Springfield, Mass., 19.—The races

at Hampton Park this afternoon are

attended by 10,000 people.

In the free for all, St. Julian easily

won the first heat in 2:19. Maud

St. will try to beat her best time.

In the second heat, St. Julian

won, Dearly second, Hopeful third;

time 2:19.

St. Julian won the third heat in

2:15.

St. Julian made the fastest time

ever known in Hampton Park, 2:15,

while trotting the third heat of the

free-for-all race to-day. The track

is considered from three to five

seconds slower than the Rochester,

so this record is considered really his

best work.

Maud S. undertook to lower the

Rochester record of 2:11, for a special

purse of \$3,000, but failed signifi-

cantly. After going once round the

track she trotted an exercise heat,

time 2:29, and shortly after under-

took to speed, but becoming nettled

by the spoken word "Go," she broke

the track which overlapped the track

on the quarter stretch, she broke

immediately and was ordered back

after passing the quarter pole, by

Capt. Stone. The third heat she

broke on the third turn, and the

whole heat was so unsatisfactory

that the judges took no time, much

to the disappointment of the betting

public. Maud S. made a final attempt

and trotted without a single break and

very handsomely, time 2:23. The turns

of the track are very bad, particu-

larly the first, so that she can

only make ordinary time while on

the back stretch. For some reason

the mare seemed not herself, being

quite a different creature than when

she showed up at Rochester.

The 2300 races were won by Pa-

rina in three straight heats—2:25, 2:25, 2:25; Edwin Thorne second;

Lady Martin third.

In the free-for-all races, St. Julian

took the first and second heats;

2:19 first heat and the last heat in

2:15. The fastest time ever made

in the free-for-all race was 2:15, by

Goldsmith Maid, four years ago.

St. Julian's driver was taken to the

judge's stand and given a magni-

ficent wreath of flowers by Prest.
