

rest to their friends in Utah: Tucson, Arizona, June 6.— The Star's special from Hermosillo says: Explorers sent out by Governor Tor-resto ascertain the existence of the volcano as reported near Bavispe, Sonora, have returned. They report an active volcano fourteen miles south-east of Bavispe, in the Sierra Madre mountains. The party could not approach nearer than within four miles of the mountains. The crater was pouring forth immense volumes of smoke, life and lava. Boiling water issued from the side of the mountain, and lava, in vast waves
