The Navy Department has ordered for several ships of war the Monitor life-saving rafts, similar to the one which crossed the Atlantic a short time ago. These rafts it is believed, will be a great security to the lives of all on board, in case of a vessel foundering at sea. The expense is light.

Boston is entitled to a medal for inaugurating the best thing out. At the depot in that city is a sign stating: "This office is placed here for the purpose of answering all questions about the going out and coming in of trains." Every union depot in the country should have just such an office.

Butler was interviewed by a Milwaukee reporter with the following result: "I don't know anything. The papers have told me nothing more than I know myself. Thereupon the people treated him as an impostor, and some even went so far as to seek his life. He was, however, strengthened with more than human strength—fought hundreds of his assailants, and when afterwards a battalion of soldiers was sent to arrest him, baffled them in their efforts to capture him.

The following curious tale is told by a writer in the *Calcutta Christian Intelligencer*. "A Chinese of some influence had a sick son. He made costly offerings to a certain god, with a view to his child's recovery. But all was vain—the child died. Hereupon the father filed a bill in court, charging the god with a breach of contract. The case was duly tried. The god was brought into court. The father pleaded that he had done everything that the ritual required of him in order to propitiate the deity, but through some strange perversion of inability, the god had failed to perform his part of the contract. The god had no way of rebutting the evidence. Judgment was accordingly given against him, and he was forthwith expelled the province.

John Hatfield, who has just died in England, at the age of 102, was a soldier in the time of William and Mary. He was tried and condemned to death, for sleeping on his post on the terrace of Windsor. He absolutely denied the charge and solemnly declared that, instead of sleeping on his post, he distinctly heard the clock of St. Paul's strike thirteen at midnight. The truth of this was much doubted by the G. O. because of the great distance of St. Paul's from the post where he was stationed. While under sentence of death, affidavit was made that the clock of St. Paul's did actually strike 13 instead of 12 upon that night, which circumstance saved his life, and he was pardoned by His Majesty.
