

rupted early in the farming districts by chilling showers and temperature. In some parts of England the rain was a little less than a deluge. Over a large extent of the best wheat-growing country it has fallen with unwelcome copiousness. The paper thinks no reliable estimate can be made. It thinks the wheat crop will be ten per cent. under the average, but about 7,000,000 quarters worse than last year. If the next few weeks are rainy and chilly, the cereal crop will be under the figures, and the level will sink with every day of adverse weather, which throws the work of the harvest to a late period of the autumn. It hopes the country will be able to get along with an import of 13,000,000 quarters of wheat.

LIV^{ER}POOL, 16;—The Daily Post and Daily Courier of this city announce this morning the death of President Garfield, and publish obituary notices.

CITY OF MEXICO, 16.—Twenty-one lives were lost and thirty persons were wounded by the disaster at Mazatlan. Reynold and Louis Zenichers, owners of the powder which exploded, destroying also two blocks and a half of buildings, have been arrested. In consequence of the position of the merchants, the government may arrange with Vera Cruz a railroad freight reduction for coal. The Superintendent of the Republic works has appointed a commission to propose measures for cheap importation of coal.

The Governor of Canals communicated yesterday by telegraph the assassination of two Americans near Aldema. Two persons were arrested on suspicion of being the murderers. They were shot in Tampico road while attempting to escape. The Governor was advised to take most efficient measures for the security of travel and the punishment of criminals.

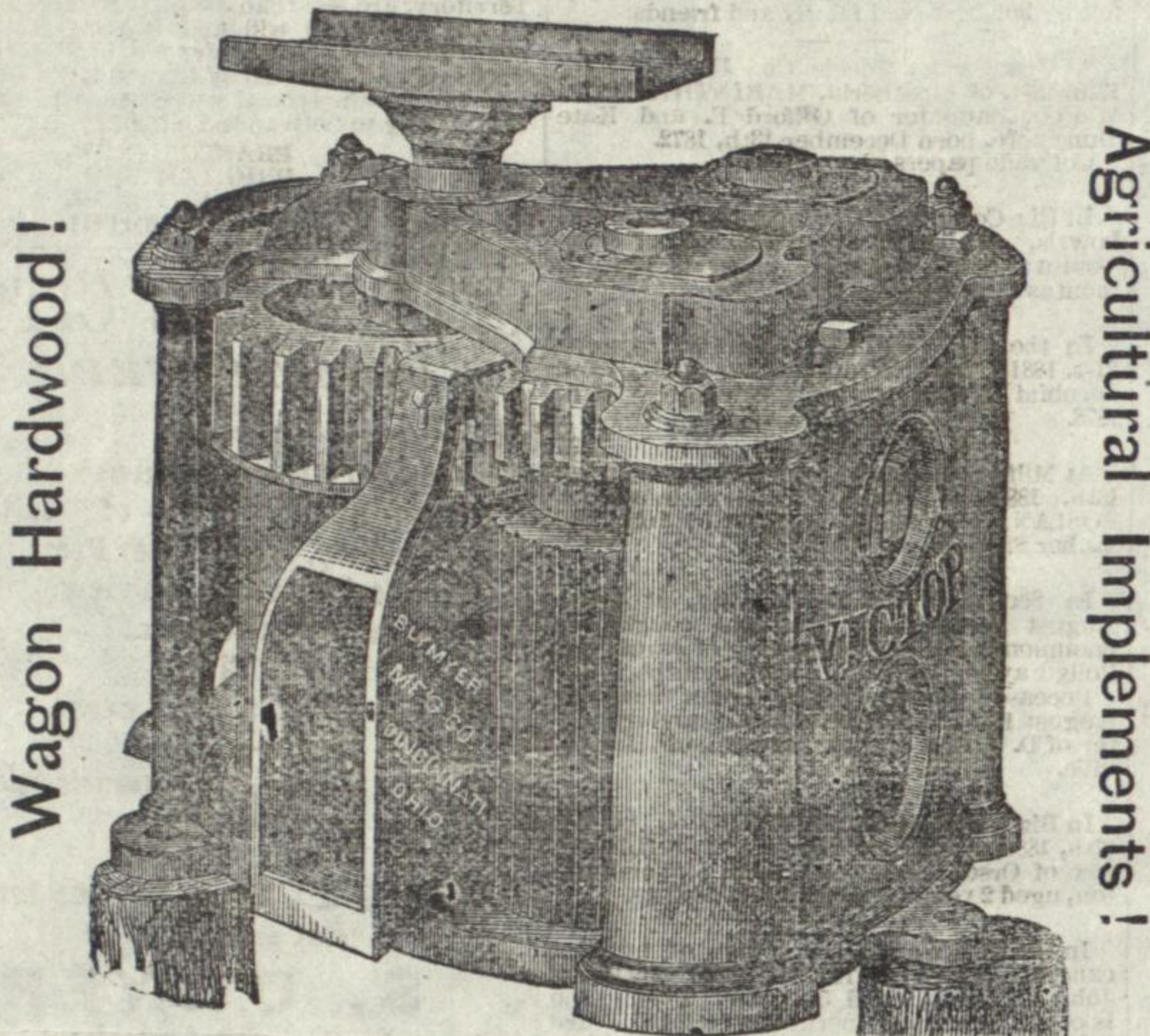

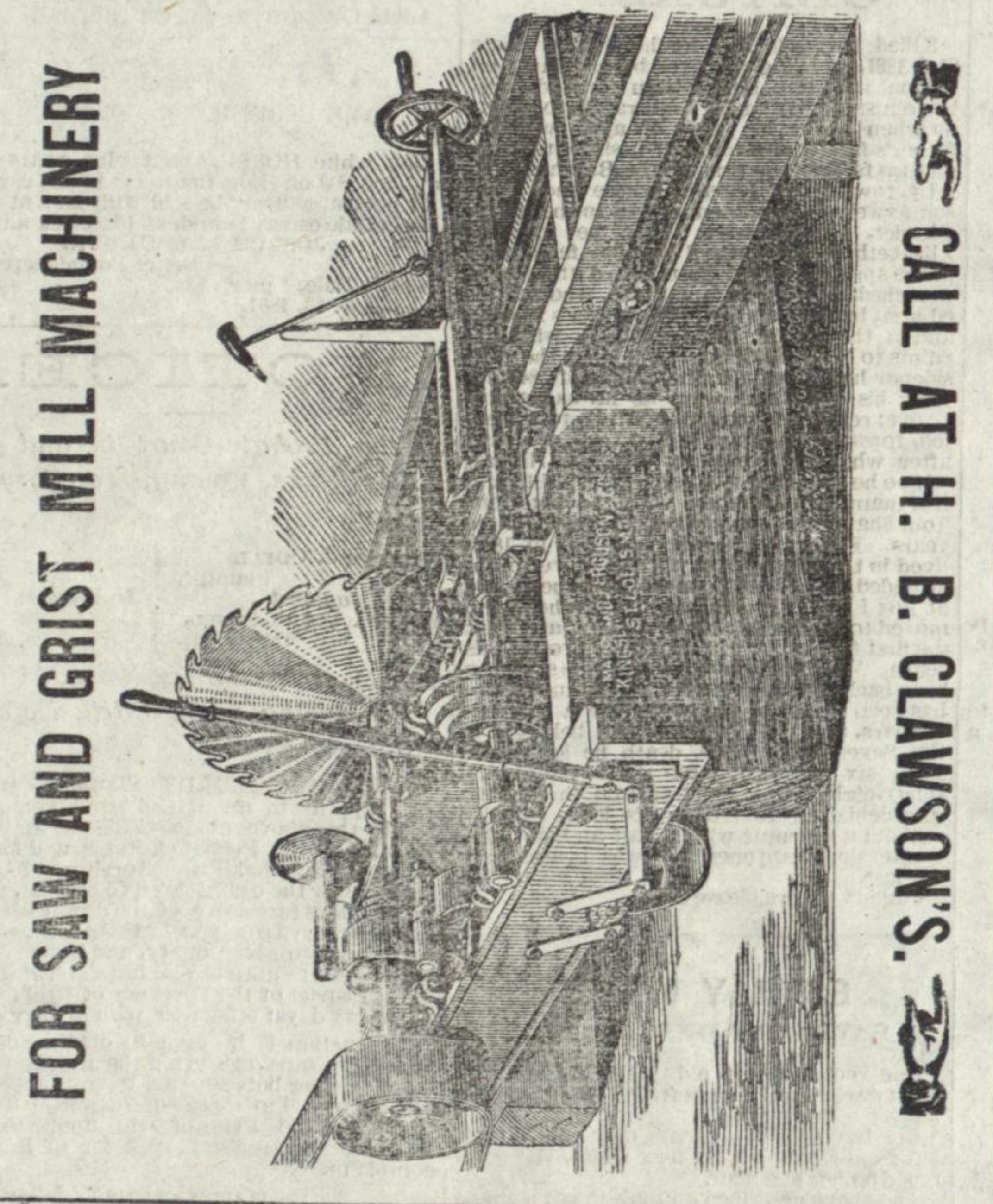

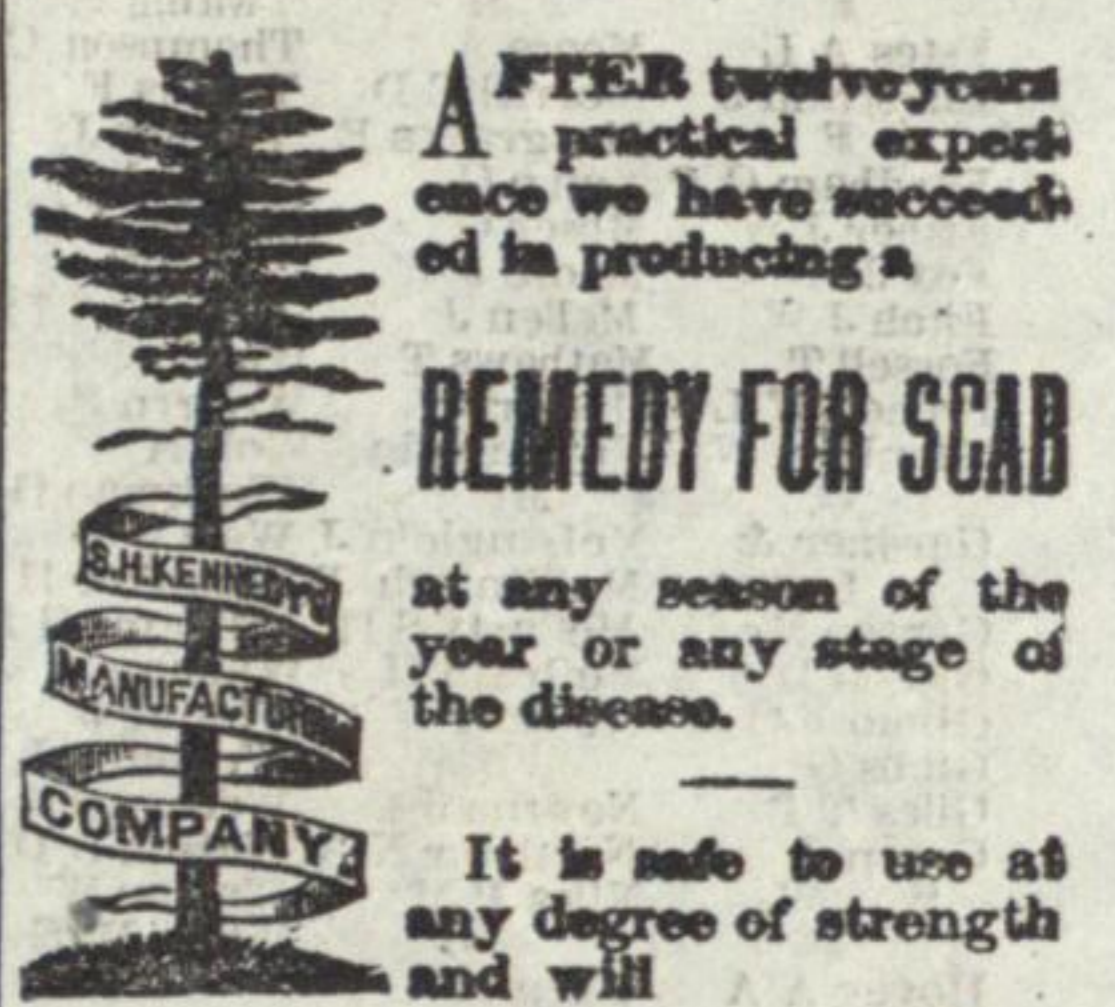
