Shaugh, the clerk who was suspended by the postoffice department, stated tonight that he was preparing a report for sub-mission to the chief clerk regarding the Brotherhood of Rallway Postal Clerks which he has been instrumental in or-ganizing. He said: "This is a benevolent order with head-quarters in this city and including 30 of 120 postal clerks who run out of Los Angeles Within the past few days I have received applications from Scattle Port-land, Tacoma and New Orleans for tem-porary charters authorizing the formation of branch organizations. These will be issued as soon as we receive our charter from the socretary of state. About 200 members of the brotherhood are at San Francisco."
