Advance. Havana, March 5.-The present sugar crop will prove a financial failure unless the price of sugar advances. Although the weather is good and the abundance of cane has enabled grinding to be car ried on without interrruption the cost of production is excessive. The cost of labor is nearly double the average for recent years, Spanish silver is nearly at par and the railroads rates are very high. Planters complain that they are working exclusively for the benift of the railroads, which are charging from \$2 to 50 cents for hauling a sack of sugar, 325 pounds weight to port. It is alleged that the principal railroad which recent-ly increased its stock 50 per cent did so that the high dividends it is earning might continue. These, it is sail, are al-most eutirely due to the high freight rates on sugar.

THE WRIGHT MURDER.
