WASHINGTON, 8.—D. R. Linderman, Director of Mints, expresses the opinion that the true policy of the U.S. is to adhere to a gold standard, and before gold resumption, to put in circulation all subsidiary silver coins which may be required for the pusposses change. If countries like France, Germany, Helland, Belgium and Great Britain, which have large amounts of silver coins on hand, are suffering from their depreciation, and should call an international convention to consider the question of fixing a new relation in the gold and silver coins, it would be corr duty, Linderman thinks, to join them.
