Special Correspondence. Manti, Sanpete Co., Jan. 13 .- Prof. Andrew C. Smyth, the well known musician, died yesterday at his home here, after a long illness, Mr. Smith was born in Manchester.

England, Feb. 29, 1840, and came to Utah in 1864. The same year he went to Logan, where he was employed as a school teacher and instuctor of music He organized a county choir and taught many who afterwards became choir leaders in Cache county. In 1869 he moved to Mendon, in the same county, following his profession there until 1873, when he moved to Salt Lake City. There he became prominent in musica affairs, as choir leader, choral instrucaffairs, as choir leader, choral instruc-tor and conductor of juvenile operas. He also composed many beautiful hymn tunes and anthems, which now have place in the L. D. S. publications, He moved to Sanpete county in 1885, lo-cating at Fountain Green. When the Manti temple was completed in 1887, Prof. Smyth was chosen as a recorder and singing conductor for that sacred
