It is then boiled up to about water, and when boiled down the frame is taken apart and removed, and when needed for use the mass is cut with a large knife. This simulates putting up cordage for use on a large scale. If the food is needed in an instant, it can be eaten there and not in troughs, or even in the woods in emergency.
