Sowing Mulberry Seed -- Father Graves submits the following to the readers of the NEWS, concerning the sowing of mulberry seed; "Make the ground rich with good manure, dug in deeply and well mixed with the soil, which should be light or somewhat sandy in character. Sow in drills, about half an inch deep, and cover over with screened mould. Keep it moist by sprinkling with a watering pot every other evening, until the seed comes up. Sow any time from now till the first of June if the weather permits. Seed can be had (the Multi Alba) of Henry Smith, seedsman, this city.
