# EDITORIALS.

### A RELIC OF BARBARISM.

THE Hebrew Leader justly complains of the barbarous custom of using the appellation "Jew" as au epithet. This it rightly denounces as "a relic of barbarism." Judalam, it claims, is not a nationality, for there is now, no Jewish nation and no Judea. Yet if a Hebrew is in court under arrest, or as a party to a suit, no designation of religiou or nationality is made of religiou or nationality is made in regard to any one elle, but he is described by his religion. If a Baptist or a Methodist happens to be charged with an offense, no men-tion is made of the denomination to which he belengs—and, indeed, it would be thought extremely dis-curteous to do so; but if he is a Jew, the fact is at once made known to the world, though his ancestors may the world, though his ancestors may have settled here in colonial days, and members of the family have shed their blood for their country a

hundred years ago. The same remarks apply to the custom of using the term "Mormon" in a similar manuer. That word is a posituled for Latter-day Saint by persons of a contrary faith. It is a nickname. And It has reference to a person's religion, not to his nationa person's religion, not to his nation-ality or occupation. If a member of the Church of Jeaus Christ of Lat-ter-day Saints is accused of any-thing criminal or improper, it is an-nounced to the world that he is a "Mormon," But if he is a non-"Mormon," the public are not en-lightened as to whether he is a Methodist, a Congregationalist, a Baptist, an Episcopalean, a Catholic or of any other religion. The Lea-der rightly says, "To use a man's religion as an epithet is contrary to the tolerant provisions of the Con-stitution of the United States, to en-lightened journalism and to courlightened journalism and to cour-tasy. It is a legacy of old-time pre-judice which ought to be perempto-rily banished from the use by tongue or pen."

"Those who are fond of the phrase, 'a relic of barbarism" when speak-ing of the system of plural marriage, should reflect on the Hebrew Leader's application of the term. It is of the same nature as the injustice of holding a sect or society responsi-ble for the acts of a few of its mem-bers, when the rules and tenois thereof are contrary to such doings. There are a great many relics of barbarism left in what is called civilized society, far more deserving of such designation than the practice to which it is so often applied.

#### A BASE SLANDER REFUTED

A vew weeks ago the public were informed through dispatches to the press, that the "Mormons" had murdered some settlers in Arizona, on the San Pedro River, in order to prevent "Gantile" colonization in their neighborhuod. We refrained from making any remarks on this evident falsehood until we could learn the facts in the case. The following letter gives the par-ticulars, and the clippings from Arizona papers below should be sufficient to refute the slander. The annexed is from the Tombstone, Arizona, Epilaph of March 27th: The Chronicle's telegrams from this place in reference to the murder of Muhlson and partner, near Benson, does great injustice to the Mormon colony on the San Peuro by al-triburing the murder to them to provent any Gentiles from getting a foothold in their neighborhood. The Epitaph has no love for the Mormons, but, barring their beasily ro-ligious dogmas, believes them generally to be peaceable and law-abiding citizens, more expecially the mombers of the colony men-tioned.

Republican of March 25th: It appears that the mystery of the killing of Mahlson and his partner on the San Pedro, on the 14th inst., has come to light, and that two Mexicans from Benson wordthe murder-ers. In a druhken moment they confessed their crime to a negro by the name of George H. Bush, who informed Deputy Sheriff Breaz-enridge, who was in Benson on business. Ho brought word to Sheriff Ward, who started out on Monday last and went to Benson, where he met Hush, whom he took in a wag-on and started aftor the criminals. He found them at St. Davids, where they were arcested. Their names were Hobles and Gar-cia. Sheriff Ward brought them in last even-ing. Their examination was set for to-day before Justice Swahn.

Although the tenets and teach-ings of the "Mormon" Church are ings of the "Mormon" Church are directly opposed to the taking of hu-man life—except in legal punish-ment for capital crime—It is diffi-oult to make the public understand that the "Mormons" are the last persons likely to engage in any such persons likely to engage in any such outrages as those attributed to them. If any person calling himself a Latter-day Baint or "Mormon" is guilty of any of those deeds of vi-olence which are properly condemn-ed by the law, as they are by all peo-ple who respect each other's rights, he cannot claim and the world can-not fairly charge, that this lawless not fairly charge, that this world tan-not fairly charge, that this lawless acts are inculcated or permitted by his religion. It is a principle of the "Mormon" creed that "a murderer hath no eternal life ablding in him." "Thou shalt not kill" has been re-newed as a direct commendment of "Thou shall hot fill" has been re-newed as a direct commandment of God to the Latter-day Saints. And they have been further instructed that if any of them shall kill, they shall not only be dealt with by the Church authorities and judged on their fellowship, but "he or she shall be delivered up to the laws of the land." the land."

Our people who are building up the waste places in other Territories are not disposed to interfere with the are not disposed to interfere with the rights of other persons whether of person or property. They will res-pect the laws of the Territories or States in which they reside, and no one need be under any anxiety con-cerning them. They will be found to be the very best colonizers of all the new comers in those regions and the most valuable of citizens, not the most valuable of citizers, not only bringing with them material wealth in the means and ability to develop the natural resources of the country, but exhibiting all those qualities which are essential to an

qualities which are essential to an orderly and progressive community. Every "Mormon" who settles in Arizona is a source of riches; to the Territory, and so with those of our people who settle in other places. As to the "beastly religious dog-mas" of the "Mormone," they con-sist in making criminal in the highest degree, any sexual inter-course out of the marrisge relation, and in encouraging matrimony for and in encouraging matrimony for the purest and holiest of purposes, permitting men under certain strict regulations of a religious character to marry more than one wife. We are willing to compare our religious dogmas with those of our traducers at any time and have no fear of the results. We commend the refuta-tion of the slander about the Arizona "Mormons" to the kindly considera-tion of those who published the falsehood, and trust that some of them will have the manliness to make the needed correction.
