

LUCK OF A NEGRO.

THE COMES IN FOR A FORTUNE  
 WORTHY ABOUT \$100,000.

All the Athenians know Dan  
 Tallaford, the colored laborer, who  
 did business in this city and after  
 wards moved to Jacksonville, Fla.,  
 and married. Dan was a polite and  
 successful man, and had the good  
 will of our people, who will be glad  
 to know that he will soon come in  
 possession of a handsome fortune,  
 estimated at about \$100,000.

His story is a strange one. On  
 Dan's removal to the land of flowers  
 he met a colored girl of Key West,

 were married. It now seems that  
 the proud blood of Castle flowers
