

PRESIDENT TAFT PROMISES TO COME

He Will be Present at Twentieth Meeting of Transmississippi Commercial Congress.

HELD IN DENVER AUG. 16 TO 21

Subjects to be Discussed Are of Nation-Wide Interest and of Very Great Variety.

Denver, Colo., March 21.—Sen. Arthur P. Francis of the Transmississippi commercial congress, today issued the official call for the twentieth annual session of that association, to be held in Denver, Aug. 16 to 21, inclusive, of this year. Added interest attaches to the meeting this year from the fact that President Taft will be present and take part in the proceedings. A large attendance of representatives of the Latin-American countries is also expected in the interest of closer international relations between this country and the republics of South, Central America and Mexico. One thing will be barred, according to the executive committee, and that is discussion of questions of a political nature.

Beside the question of closer relations with the southern republics with especial reference to the early completion of the Panama canal and the consequent stimulating commercial development in the Transmississippi states, the following questions will come under discussion:

National defense with especial reference to the needs of the Pacific coast and Hawaii.

An adequate merchant marine and the need of government aid in its up-building and maintenance.

Conservation of natural resources. This promises to be one of the leading questions to come before the congress.

Irrigation and reclamation of semi-arid lands.

Waterway improvements. Drainage of submerged lands. Scientific dry-farming.

Alaska.

Separate statehood for New Mexico and Arizona.

Parcels post.

Postal savings banks.

Insurance.

Trade relations with Mexico, Central and South America.

Gulf ports and the railroads.

Panama canal.

Hawaii.

The Philippines.

Department of mines.

Immigration.

Good roads.

Sugar beet and cane industry.

Barataria and Lafourche.

National finance.

Consular service.

The governor of each state and territory may appoint 10 delegates and not more than 10. The mayor of each city may appoint one delegate and one additional delegate for every 5,000 people, not, however, to exceed 10 delegates. Each business organization may appoint one delegate and one additional for every 50 members, not to exceed 10 delegates.

Each county may appoint one delegate.

Governors of states and territories, members of Congress and former presidents of Transmississippi congress, are ex-officio members.

PHILIPPINES AND RECIPROCITY

Insular Officials Much Concerned Over Prospective Loss of Revenue.

AVERSE TO TARIFF CHANGES

Gov. Gen. Smith Believes Payne Bill Would Seriously Cripple Islands Financially.

Manila, March 22.—Officials of the insular government, members of the Philippine assembly and others in close touch with the affairs of the Philippine government, are seriously concerned over the loss in revenues which will result from the establishing of reciprocal free trade between the islands and the United States under the provisions of the Payne tariff bill. It is feared that the deficit for the first year, due to the decrease in customs revenues, will approximate 5,000,000 pesos (\$2,500,000), and that it will increase from year to year with the growth of American imports.

If these closer trade relations with the United States reduce the islands to poverty, it will become possible later to impose direct taxation to cover the deficiencies. In the meantime, it is feared that the Philippine will suffer seriously during the readjustment period, and that the government will be forced, in all probability, to abandon many of the important works it has undertaken.

Gov. Gen. Smith has communicated with Secy. of War Dickinson, expressing his views on the tariff and declaring it as his opinion that the insular government would be seriously crippled financially by the operations of the Payne bill.

The consideration of the tariff question is having a marked effect on local business conditions. Virtually all future engagements of an important nature are being postponed, as importers are without any basis of calculation. It is expected that this situation will continue until the provisions of the

PRINCIPLES REGARDING LAW OF MARITIME WAR

Washington, March 21.—The declaration of principles regarding the law of maritime war agreed upon by the conference of 19 of the principal maritime nations of the world, held in London during the past winter, and known as the Maritime conference, were made public at the state department today. The principles announced in the declaration are to act as a guide for the government of international prize court to be established at The Hague.

The American delegates are satisfied the code contains much that will prove of great advantage in time of war. This is especially the case with the articles treating of contraband, the estimates being made that under the head of conditional contraband, exports, appropriation at this time would amount to a year, would be affected in the event of war, and under the head of free contraband exports approximating \$400,000,000.

The essence of the declaration on blockade is that it must be confined to the ports and coasts belonging to or oc-

cupied by the enemy, and that the blockade to be binding must be effective.

The Anglo-American doctrine of notice of blockade was adopted as against the continental. This is that notice through diplomatic channels or the establishment of such blockade is sufficient.

WOULD GIVE PORTO RICANS A DELEGATE IN CONGRESS

Washington, March 22.—In lieu of the present resident commissioner from Porto Rico to the United States, it is the idea of Representative Cooper of Wisconsin, to have that island elect a delegate to the house, according to the provisions of a bill recently introduced by him.

The delegate may have the right to debate and not to vote and shall receive the same salary and allowances and rights accorded to the delegates from the territories of the United States. To be eligible he must be a bona fide citizen and voter of Porto Rico, be at least 25 years of age and must read and write the English language.

Chicago, March 22.—New light is thrown on the 5-cent theater problem by Mrs. William L. Thomas of the juvenile court women's committee, who urges the establishment of a "municipal nickel theater."

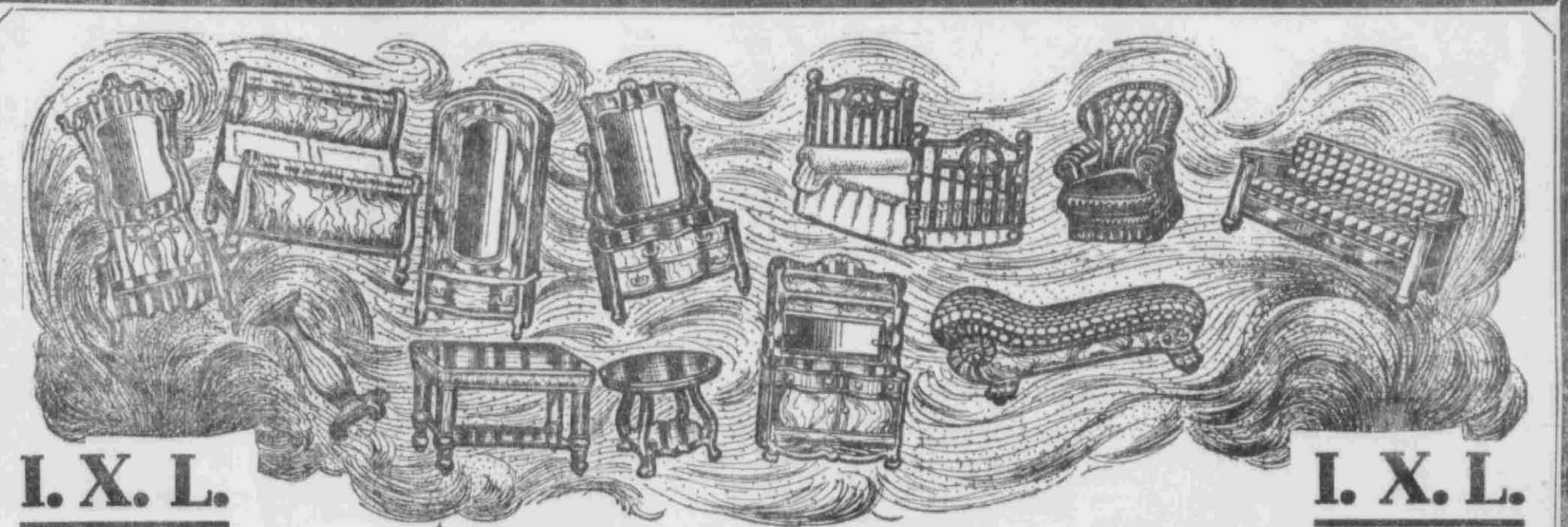
