EARTHQUAKES IN DIVERSE PLACES.

THE POWERS CARVING UP THE DARK CONTINENT.

DISPATCH FROM WOLSELEY ETC.

Earthquake Shocks.

London, 7.—A slight earthquake shock was felt in the south of England, and a few houses were damaged. Several shocks were felt the past few days in the Canton of Grisons, Switzerland, and the Department of Haute Savoie, France.

Madrid, 7.—Another very sharp shock of earthquake was felt in the south of Spain, and a few houses were damaged. A great number of people were injured. Most of the inhabitants had left and were sleeping in tents. King Alfonso was in the city at the time of the shock. Three hundred thousand dollars have already been subscribed for the relief of the sufferers, and the king has offered to contribute his own share.

Paris, 7.—The proposed treaty for the relief of earthquake sufferers in Spain and Portugal, which was signed by the French government, has been approved by the French Chamber of Deputies.
