How do you do, Mr. Editor?

Do you and your subscribers expect fresh, raw, laid eggs from your own flocks at Christmas?

Of course you have the chickens, early puffed hatched in April or May.

The next necessity is a water and food trough outside. Then, the size of a shin is best, will cause your fowls to have more swelled heads and closed nostrils than eyes if you had taken out the whole window or left the door open with the intention of getting out. Just as well to have one side open to a window, a little way open, or a very small piece of glass put in one corner and you will have something more than an idea what gives your chickens giddiness and makes them swim around. If you see these signs in your flock, stop the excess by driving pins at wood into them, or cracks with rags or rope.

Then see that everything is clean and dry, and the fowls will be healthy.

This should take care of all.
