The Road to Prosperity.

I have just read over the last number of the record of the Five Points House of Industry of New York, and find that for the month of August no provisions at all were sent in except twenty-five pies from some establishment in the city. The house is over full, and still they are pressing in, begging for admittance. Good farmer friends, send in your tithes, and the Lord will send you down a blessing that will make your heart keep a glad thanksgiving. Tithe the potatoes and turnips and cabbages, send in the barrels of apples from your bending orchard trees. If you get the ear of the right man most railroads will pass such freights free, and the Lord will not forget it of that railroad. If these tithes could only become a national thing we should see such a tide of prosperity roll over the land as has never before blessed it. Who will aid in the good work? Who will be one of the factors in producing it? Who will be one to receive the blessings on his own hearth stone?
