At six this morning we were all very agreeably surprised to see Irand sound on a borrowed horse, followed by his faithful dog. He had not seen nor heard of the searching party. When he separated from his wounded brother, instead of moving toward home, he made his way on foot in the night to Coyote Creek, 40 miles from here where he travel ed after sundown and before sunrise yesterday morning. He stopped at Maxwell's ranch, on Goyote Creek,

till nearly sundown, when he bor-rowed a horse, saddle and gun, and made his way home traveling all last night.
