His friends announce that he as decided upon retaining Charles O'Conner, David Dudley Field, Caleb Cushing, George Ticknor, Murtis and Wm. Evarts, as counsel. It is intimatd that Mr. Evarts was retained because he controls a very large Republican infuence in New York, which can be brought to bear on the leading Republicans, and bring them, indirectly, to support the President. It is also given out that Jerry Black will not be retained for certain unexplained reasons. Black's friends, in consequence, are somewhat excited.

A number of politicians are endeavoring to fix up a candidate for the Vice Presidency. Great interest is felt in the proceedings of the Ohio Republican Convention of next Wednesday. Should the delegates be instructed to support Wade for Vice President, it is believed he will be nominated. The probable removal of Johnson makes Wade the prominent candidate, on account of the patronage which will be at his disposal. A strong effort is being made to secure the election of Montgomery Blair as Senator from Maryland, in place of Thomas rejected. It is said Thomas himself is arguing the necessity of elect-ing some man who will not be rejected, and who is an earnest friend of the President. It is reported that Hancock has asked to be relieved from the command of Orleans, on account of Grant's action directing him to reinstate the councilmen whom he had removed.
