READY FOR BATTLE.

SILVER AND Gold-Silver Men Reach an
Agreement Today.

DEBATE TO BEGIN AT ONCE.

A Vote on the Silver Bill to be
Taken in the House on
August 28th.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—The brief proceedings in the Senate yesterday, coming after the action of the day before, indicate that parties in the Senate are beginning to line up. There is a slight shift on the Republicans, who are shown on the part of a few silver men, but generally they have adopted the policy of assuring their opponents by insisting upon the immediate conversion of the silver question. They are to submit and casting for two days to put the situation on record, of the Republicans' leaders in financial matters said that they would like to see the bill of action until the majority were obliged to make a stand. He insisted that the Democrats could not charge the Republicans with partisan action enough as they were simply trying to give immediate effects to the President's executive order, and that the Democratic senators wanted the attempt of the Republicans to control the Senate and dilute the character of the legislation. They have insisted that they will not permit any bill that will not be submitted on a line of policy, and the action of the Republicans has had the effect of consolidating all elements on the Democratic side upon this resolution.

WORKING COOPERATIVELY.

Meanwhile, the Democratic committee is in almost constant session, trying to arrange a plan of action and the several committees on the Republican side are quite active, working themselves to develop means to carry out their ideas, as that the session in the Senate promises to be interesting. Between now and Monday it is hoped by the leaders that a bill will be introduced which some plan of action may be agreed upon on the silver question.

Attention is concentrated upon the struggle in the House between the silver and anti-silver delegations. The forces on both sides will be strong, but the outcome is dubious with the general trend of opinion toward an absolute disagreement and declaration of war. A conference of the silver men on the silver question was called for at 10 o'clock this morning, and the eagerness and anxiety of each side was made apparent by the early arrival of the parties to the conference.

The silver men's part of the program is to first a resolution looking to voting at the present time; if defeated, votes will be taken on amending the existing law; raising the ratio at 17, 18, 19 and 20 in order, and finally, if these fail, upon the Bland-Allison act.

AN AMMUNITION MEETING.

The conference of silver and anti-silver men has reached an agreement to work together in the interest of the bill for the repeal of the Sherman law will be limited to eleven days. This will be followed by a debate of three days under the five minute rule, when voting will be taken on amending the existing silver amendments. The present arrangement is that the repeal bill will be introduced in the House today, and that the accompanying resolution shall prescribe the method of voting, so that the bill will be voted on at once. If carried out, this program will bring the House to a vote on the bill and amendment on August 28th.

A COMPANY Mustered Out.

Consignments of Cattle.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., Aug. 11.—A number of cattle and horses, which have already been shipped to the Chicago and Omaha markets from Wyoming. Letters received from the commission men state that cattle from the southern part of the state are in market condition, and that cattle from the Northern Mountain and Northern Wyoming are in average condition. The extreme dry weather has cut the ranges short.

A BIG FIRE.

Many Business Houses and Dwellings
Reported Burned.

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Aug. 11.—A big fire is reported raging at Mutual Coal, Ohio. The loss has already amounted to \$100,000. A number of business houses and dwellings are already destroyed.
