

BIG WATER STORAGE SCHEME.

Utah Light and Power Company to Construct a Series of Great Reservoirs for Power and Irrigation Purposes— Plans as Outlined.

The past year has been a very prosperous one for the Utah Light and Power company and the year 1900 closes with a better power and light service than has ever been given to the citizens of Salt Lake City and Ogden. While the people are as a whole, well pleased with the service of 1900, the company is also well satisfied with the conditions at the close of the year.

As at present equipped the company has a maximum capacity of some 8,500 horse power. This includes the power of the Ogden or Pioneer plant, in addition to the Cottonwood plants and the steam service, in Salt Lake City. All of these plants are at present running in parallel and in addition the company is running the engines at the west side sub-station and also the Salt Lake City Railway company's machinery.

BIG STORAGE SCHEME.

It is the intention of the company to continue to keep well ahead of the demand and with this object in view the company has already projected a plan to store over ten billion gallons of water annually by a series of reservoirs to be constructed on the north, south and middle forks of Ogden river, to be used for power generating and irrigation purposes. The preliminary steps to this stupendous undertaking were recently begun by the company filing notices appropriating all the waters of Ogden river and suitable reservoir sites in the locality mentioned.

AT BIG COTTONWOOD.

In addition to the above the company contemplates erecting a power plant at the mouth of Big Cottonwood canyon at the old Granite Paper Mill site; also constructing reservoirs in the canyon for the improvement of the whole system, thus greatly increasing the company's generating capacity.

A great many improvements have been made this year both in the residence and business districts. The former has now been brought under one system, while with the exception of a small arc circuit the alternating sys-

tem has been greatly extended in the business district. During the year the company has also centralized all the high tension wires at the west side sub-station, with the exception of the Street Railway power. The wires entering the sub-station carrying very high voltages which are there reduced for service throughout the city. The company has spent \$25,000 during the year in machinery and improvements in the stations. In addition to this \$40,000 has been spent in extending the service. A high tension line has been built to the Bingham Copper and Gold Mining Co.'s new smelter, while a number of improvements have been made in Ogden in order to reach the principal streets. The changes there, however, are not nearly as great as in Salt Lake City. As showing the growing popularity of electric light among smaller consumers it may be stated that the company had over 600 patrons on lets lists during last summer who were within the \$1 mark per month. In addition to this the electric current is being used in a number of homes for iron heaters, cooking, etc. The demand for motors has also been good this year. The service has been regular as it has need to be when it is considered that the big Germania and Sandy smelters are being run by electricity. It is the intention of the company to increase the effectiveness of the steam plant so that a shortage from any cause might be speedily overcome.

GAS OUTPUT.

The gas output in Salt Lake City is 400,000 cubic feet per day while the Ogden plant is sending out 60,000 feet per day. Some improvements have been made in the Salt Lake plant this year.

The growing success of the Utah Light and Power company is largely due to the fact that energetic local men are at the back of it. The officers are: George Q. Cannon, president; J. B. Winder, vice president; and L. S. Hill, treasurer. These form the executive committee, the other directors being Joseph P. Smith, W. S. McCorkrick, T. G. Webber, Judger Clawson, W. J. Curtis of New York, and J. J. Hannigan of Providence, R. I. R. S. Campbell is secretary and manager, and R. F. Hayward is electrical engineer.
