THE SEVENTH CONGRESS.
SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 6.—After a short
executive session, the Senate
proceeded to the consideration of the
tariff bill.

Ferry asked unanimous consent
to take up the post route bill, and
said in his opinion and in the opinion
of the public, the tariff bill
would not pass this session, and if
newspapers could be believed, this
was the opinion of the President
himself.

Several Senators insisted on pro-
ceeding with the tariff bill, and Fer-
ry accepted the suggestion that the
post route bill be taken up to-mor-
row, and the tariff bill was taken
up, the pending question being on
the amendment offered by Beck last
evening, extending the duty of 10
cents per pound laid by the bill
upon wool of the first class, the value
whereof at the last port of place
whence exported to the United
States, excluding charges in such
port, shall be 30 cents per pound or
less, to such wools valued at 32
cents per pound; agreed to, 55 to 24.

Aldrich and Dawes opposed Sher-
man's amendment, and then Sher-
man modified it so as to read as fol-
lows: Woolen cloths, shawls, and
all manufactures of wool, of every
description, made wholly or in part
of wool, not specially enumerated
or provided for in this act, val-
ued at not exceeding 90 cents per
pound, 35 cents per pound and 35
cents ad valorem; valued at above
90 cents per pound, 35 cents per
pound and 35 cents ad valorem. This
was agreed to, and Beck's amend-
ment having been withdrawn, the
paragraph was left in this form.

On motion of Aldrich, the duty on
flannels, blankets, hats of wool, knit
goods and all goods made on knit-
ting frames, balmores, woolen and
worsted yarns, and all manufactures
of every description, composed
wholly or in part of wool, the hair
on alpaca goats or other animals, ex-
cept such as are composed in part
of wool, and specially enumerated
or provided for, valued at above 90
cents per pound, was made 35 cents
per pound, and 35 cents ad val-
orem.

On Beck's motion, the duty on
bunting was reduced from 12 to 10
cents per square yard, and 35 per
cent ad valorem.
