Gladstone's wife gives four hours of each day to the poor.

The Basle Missionary Society proposes to establish in Persia an institution for receiving and educating orphan children whose parents have died during the late famine.

The Vanderbilt of Melbourne is known as "Big Clarke." He enjoys an income of over \$1,000,000 yearly, which he has gained as a butcher, grazier, and usurer. He spends next to nothing, and lunches daily off the cheapest dishes of the cheapest restaurants.

Self acting fans were introduced in England last summer, with great success: The fan, which is of extra size, is attached to a stand which can be placed on a table or clasped on the back of a chair. By a most simple mechanism, not in the least likely to get out of order, the fan is moved backward and forward, producing a gentle current of air.
