Editor Deseret News:

I am pleased that Utah County is entering the category of authors by adding to the list a most excellent work entitled "Autobiography and Poems." The author of this work is Sister Hannah Cornaby, of Spanish Fork.

I have had the pleasure of a perusal of both the autobiography and poems of this talented lady, and can assure the readers of the NEWS an excellent treat in both. The autobiography was, at first, intended to occupy about 25 printed pages, but had it been confined to this space many interesting incidents in the life of the author would necessarily have been omitted; as it is, it contains but a brief outline of an eventful life-history.

The autobiography alone will consist of about 50 pages, and will, itself be well worth the price of the book, giving, as it does, a narration of a life devoted to Christian virtues.

The author does not claim ability as a poet, in the common acceptance of the term, (which too often consists of flights of imagination devoid of meaning to the generality of readers) but her poems although mostly written while laboring under severe affliction, possess merit in being true to principle and incident; and, while discarding the flighty and imaginative they deal in life incidents and infuse an inspiration which cheers and comforts, while it enlightens and purifies.

The circulars announcing the book promised the public a work of about 130 pages, for \$1.00, but I am pleased to learn that on account of the autobiography having been extended, the book will contain about 150 pages without adding to the original price.

By special request, it is concluded to bind a limited number of copies in morocco, with gilt edges, which will be fit to place on any drawing-room table. We hope the people will sustain this addition to the increasing literature of Utah, to the extent its merit deserves. I learn that over one-half of the book is now in type, and will be ready in a few weeks for publication.

YUMA, Yuma Co.,
Arizona, Feb. 11, 1881.

Editor Deseret News:

Yuma city is situated on the east side of the Colorado River, about one half mile below the mouth of the Gila River. Fort Yuma is on the west side of the river. There is a railroad bridge across the river from Yuma City to Fort Yuma. The Colorado River is the dividing line between Arizona and California. For some distance up and down the river from Yuma the steamboats come up the river to this place and some of them go up about 150 miles beyond to Eldorado Canon. It is about 30 miles south to the line of Mexico and 180 miles west to San Bernardino, Cal., and 185 miles east to Mesa City on Salt River. The Yuma Indians live on the river near to this place; they are at present camped on the California side of the river. I visited one of their camps yesterday. The Yuma Indians are a branch broken off from the Apaches a long time ago. The Apaches still call them the Yuma Apache. Twenty years ago the Yumas numbered 3,000. They are now reduced to 350. They seem to be a very intelligent Indian, but are fast passing away. I have distributed some circulars on our faith among the Mexican people of this place and will hold a meeting to-night for the benefit of the Americans. I will return to Pima on the Upper Gila, in a few days, by way of Mesa City. There is some land on the Gila River, about 60 miles above this place, to be taken up, and some ranches to sell very cheap. There is also some good land up and down the Colorado, where a ditch could be made to take out the water from the Colorado river. The trees are all leaving out in this country at this time of the year.

low as 35 deg. below zero. Work is lively, and there is large demand for both coal and coke at Leadville and Breckenridge. I also have noticed some new hoisting engines and other machinery for the above places, which looks as if they were preparing for business in the spring. The shops and roundhouse at Grant, on the D. S. P. & P. R. R. were burnt down some time ago, and they now are going to build them in Como, as that will be a junction next summer. The road to Breckenridge will be completed then. That is quite a bright prospect for Como.

There was a number of men from Utah here, working on the grade for the Breckenridge extension or branch, and had all the work they wanted.

The health of the people has been pretty good generally. There is some sickness among small children, and our esteemed brother, H. T. Nickols, lost his youngest boy, nearly a year old. He has the sympathy of all here, losing it so far from home.
