OPEN COMMUNICATION SOON.

Cable from Cuba via Cape Hatteras in New York.

PLAN FOR REPAIRING THE CUT CABLE.

Jan May to Send From Cape Hatteras to Restore the Cut Cable.

Cape Hatteras, June 11, 12:45 p. m.—Communication has been restored here by use of Port as before, that a large number of American boats of the United States, from Columbia, and of the allies, and that the telephone at this point is in possession of the Americans, and that every effort will be made to re-establish communication with New York as soon as possible.

CAPTURED A SPANISH SHIP.

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SPAIN'S CASE DUPLICITY

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STAR SPANGLED BANNER.

The Glorious Ensign Waves From a Spanish Flagstaff, Placed There by American Marines.

Stars and Stripes Planted on Cuban Soil at Guantanamo—Spaniards Could Not Prevent this Landing—Reported Fall of Santiago de Cuba.

Kingston, Jamaica, June 11.—News was received here today to the effect that a force of American marines has landed on the shores of Guantanamo Bay, and that the Stars and Stripes are now flying from a Spanish flagstaff.

Cape Haytien, July 11.—There is no direct news from Cuba this morning, but the rumor is again current that Santiago de Cuba has fallen.

San Francisco, Cal., Friday, June 11.—The Stars and Stripes were hoisted on the Spanish flagstaff at Guantanamo Bay, and the American flag was planted on the Cuban soil. The Spaniards could not prevent this landing, and the Stars and Stripes are now flying from the flagstaff. The fall of Santiago de Cuba is also reported.
