INDIANAPOLIS, 5. - Complete returns from all the counties of the State save one, and one unofficial, give Lieutenant Governor, 3,667 plurality.

The Democrats have the Legislature by a majority on joint ballot.

On the basis of the returns, the Democrats are 51 House-Democrats 45, Republicans 54. The returns on the State ticket are not yet in from all the counties, but the figures of last night will not be changed materially.

Official returns from every county in the State show that the Democrats (Rep.) has 3,647 plurality for Lieutenant Governor.

The reports received do not give the total vote, but the margin of the victory is about 4,000.

The Legislature stands as follows: Senate - Democrats 19, Republicans 11. House - Democrats 51, Republicans 45.
