The Porte and the Powers.

The European governments have instructed their representatives in conference to refuse to consider Midhat Pasha's constitution, and to present on Monday what is really the European ultimatum. The powers are very determined, and undoubtedly mean to try to force the Porte to accept their pro-

posals. The plenipotentiaries will give the Porte until Wednesday or Thursday for a final and direct answer. In the event of refusal they have decided to withdraw from Constantinople. The Porte begins to show a disposition to yield, particularly in regard to some sort of international commission, which is the most important
