

ATTORNEYS URGE TECHNICALITIES.

Counsel for American Candidates Thus Attempt to Have Ballots Thrown Out.

JUDGE POWERS WILL ANSWER

Mayor Morris and Mayor-Elect Thompson Interesting Spectators At Morning Session.

The challenges made by both the contestants and contestees in the thirty-seventh district were taken up this morning by Judge Ritchie in the contest case of W. Mont Perry and P. J. Anson, the American candidates for the city council in the fourth precinct, against E. A. Hartenstein and W. J. Tuddenham, the Democratic councilmen-elect. The entire morning session was consumed by the argument of Atty. S. P. Armstrong who sought to have the 62 challenges made by him in behalf of the American candidates sustained and this afternoon Judge Powers will take up the argument in reply to Atty. Armstrong and in support of the seven challenges made in behalf of the contestees. Up to a late hour this afternoon no decision on the challenges in the thirty-seventh district had been made by Judge Ritchie.

The principal objections made by the attorneys for contestants to the ballots challenged were that they were improperly marked and not marked with the regulation cross as provided by law. On some of the ballots other marks were made instead of the cross, still others were marked with identification marks and still others had large blocks of ink upon them. All of these, the attorney contended, were spoiled and not marked according to law and should be rejected. Two of the ballots were marked with a cross under the roster, and with two large crosses across the other tickets. These, it was contended, were clearly in violation of the election laws and should be rejected. The attorney cited sections of the election laws and numerous court decisions in support of his contention.

Among the interested spectators in court this morning were Mayor Morris and Mayor-elect Thompson.

GIVEN TIME TO PLEAD.

Capt. H. D. Styer Pays High Tribute To Agricultural College.

Captain H. D. CITIZEN CHARGED WITH STEALING ELECTRICITY.

A complaint was issued by Assistant County Attorney Hanson today against W. T. Conway, who resides at 374 Fourth street, charging him with the statutory offense of stealing electricity. Conway, who is somewhat of an electrician, wired his own house, and in doing so placed a jumper in the wiring, which, when he turned the current around the meter and into the house, the wiring was done about Oct. 14 of this year, and the jumper was so arranged that it could be turned on and off at will, and by means of two springs, one for each wire. The springs could be disconnected from the jumper and connected with the meter will, and that way Conway was able to draw as much of the electricity to run through the meter as he chose, which from all appearances, was not very much, and on Dec. 9 George E. Fyfe and Don S. Campbell, inspectors for the Utah Light & Railway company, inspected the wiring of the Conway house and discovered the jumper.

The complaint which was issued today against Conway is signed by M. C. Godie, superintendent of the city electric service, and was filed in the court of Justice of the Peace—Isabel of Farmers, and the court issued a warrant for the arrest of Conway, and it is the intention of the Utah Light & Railway company to prosecute the case to the limit and make an example of the defendant.

FIERCE FIGHT WITH MANIACS.

Weber County Officers Have Exciting Experience With Nelson Family.

THREE MEMBERS DEMENTED.

Deputy Sheriffs and Policemen Taxed To the Limit to Quell Disturbance.

(Special to the "News.") Ogden, Dec. 28.—For half an hour this morning, commencing at 10:30 o'clock the sheriff's force, backed up by two policemen, had the steepest personal encounter in the history of police annals in the city. On the side of the officers were seven men, and opposed to them were two people violently insane, and a third at least partly demented. They were members of the Nelson family, residing on Stewart's lane west of Ogden, and two of them were women. Axel Nelson, the man of the trio, seemed to be endowed with unnatural strength in his frenzy. It took four big officers fully half an hour to overcome him and get the handcuffs secured upon him.
