

SOLDIERS GOT EVEN WITH MURRAY NINE

Fort Douglas Managed to Turn Tables on Smeltermen Yesterday.

JACK THORNTON'S PITCHING

Was the Main Factor in Bringing Victory for Uncle Sam's Boys In Blue.

The Murray ball fans are being treated to a fine article of the national game these days, and that they justly appreciate it is demonstrated by the fact that the games are usually heavily attended.

Yesterday's contest between the Murray team and a nine from Fort Douglas, was no exception. It was a rattling good game from start to finish and the Soldiers got even with the Smeltermen for the drubbing of the day before. The boys in blue walked off with the game by a score of five to one.

To "Happy Jack" Thornton belongs the chief credit for the warriors' victory. He was on the slab for the Soldiers and right well did he perform. But for his clever work he would not have had such different treatment. The Murray boys certainly played a good game, but they were up against a brand of dips, spurs and angles laid out by Thornton that were sure to catch them. He had the control, remarkable speed and a nature of in and out, ups and downs that would be hard to beat in any man's country. In addition to all this, the Soldiers gave Jack good support and were also better at bat than they were the day before.

That the game was a good one is shown by the fact that Wilkinson pitched for the Murray team and was given a hearty ovation. Although it was his first straight game in the box he did splendid work.

There is some talk now of another game between these teams for the 16th of July, to be played at Murray or Salt Lake. Efforts will be made to bring the game here as the teams are certainly capable of playing in big league style. Murray has the best team in the Mountain Division, so the Mountain Association is considering the proposition, and it is possible that the game will take place next Sunday.

In yesterday's game the Soldiers were bad in the first two frames, but then came the fort, and the roofing they handed over was of the strenuous order. They nearly went wild in the first inning when, with one man gone, Kirby singled to right and Wadsworth followed with a single to left, hunted one down first base line and beat the horse to the initial sack. Thornton then came up and bounded out a prettily to center. Then when Hart mashed out a single two runs came in for Uncle Sam's boys.

In the seventh two more runs came in as a result of Hart's walk and hits by Wadsworth and Wright. The last run came in the ninth.

Bert Margette saved Murray from a shut out by leaping up against one of Thornton's fast ones for two sacks. He stuck to his post and paraded home as the ball was being passed from catcher.
