

KUROPATKIN HAS A HARD TIME. While He is Fighting the Japanese He is Being Fought at St. Petersburg. CZAR SAID TO BE DISSATISFIED. Would Dismiss Him and Alexieff Were it Not for Fear of Public Opinion.

London, May 31.—The reports published in Paris of discord in the interview between Gen. Kuropatkin and Viceroy Alexieff at Mukden and the southern movement of the Russian vanguard below Wafengtung have given rise to rumors that Gen. Kuropatkin has yielded to the wishes of the Alexieff party and is attempting to relieve Port Arthur. Among other papers here, however, the idea that Gen. Kuropatkin would venture on such a dangerous and hopeless movement is not to be taken seriously.

Gen. Kuropatkin, the Telegraph's St. Petersburg correspondent says, is fighting two enemies, one at home, the other in Manchuria. While his military reputation is undergoing a terrible ordeal, he is also accused of failure, as minister of war, to make the proper preparations for war.

The correspondent also asserts that an agreement is drafted whereby Germany promises armed support to Russia if necessary to prevent England and the United States from attempting to submit the far eastern question to an international congress, and declares that the recent relaxation of anti-Jewish laws by Russia is the outcome of the desire of the minister of the interior to conciliate American opinion.

RUSSIANS ARE NERVOUS. War Will Lay Bare Many Defects in Their Government.

St. Petersburg, May 30, 3:40 p. m.—The Novy Vremya, inveighing against the nervousness produced by the latest news.

"The war will lay bare many defects in our life and administrative and political mechanism, and show us our own consequences if it shows up weak spots and directs attention to them. But the Russians must not allow themselves to become the prey of depression. In war the stronger always wins in the end. We should not be downcast at the latest news of the success of the weaker side, which is enjoying temporary numerical superiority."

The Russian invalid believes the Japanese have formed a new base between Pitsewo and Cape Terminal, Liao Tung peninsula, in conjunction with their depot on the Elliot islands, with the intention of making further disembarkments in connection with the operations against Port Arthur.

To Attack Port Arthur June 15.

London, May 31.—The attack on Port Arthur, the Chronicle's Tokyo correspondent telegraphs, is expected to begin here June 15. Correspondents will leave here June 10 in time to see the capture, probably about June 20. The correspondent also says 10,000 Russians have been sent up the Liao river in junks to the Lung.

The Post's Shanghai correspondent writes that several Japanese transports are landing troops in northeast Korea.

WHY JAPAN FIGHTS. It is for Peace and Not for Glory.

St. Louis, May 30.—Kogoro Takshira, minister plenipotentiary and envoy extraordinary of the Japanese government to the United States, arrived in St. Louis tonight.

"The people of Japan, as well as its rulers, believe that we are fighting for the integrity and existence of our nation," said the ambassador in reply to a question. "That belief is as firmly planted in the heart of the private soldier as in the highest official and it may be that alone that has done much for the success of our arms."

"Japan has grown in many ways, it is true. We have taken great pains in the last few decades to educate our people as far as possible, not in war alone, but in the arts of peace. This we believe is a fight for peace. War, however, seemed the only way to obtain it."

It was suggested that there had already been representations of mediation by friendly powers and especially by this government.

"War," he said, "is like trying a case before the supreme court. Japan and Russia are now in the midst of this."

SEVENTEENTH INFANTRY. Officers and Men Killed by Moros Interred at Cotabato, Mindanao. Manila, P. I., May 31.—The remains of the officers and men of the Seventeenth United States Infantry, recently ambushed and killed by Moros, when Lieut. Winfield Harper and 29 of the Seventeenth United States Infantry were attacked by several hundred Moros. Those killed in the ambush were Plut. Capt. Harry A. Woodruff, Second Lieut. Joseph H. Hall and 15 men of the regiment.

PERDICARIS' CAPTOR. He is an Ex-Moorish Government Employe. New York, May 31.—Jean Hesa, an explorer who has just returned from Morocco, in discussing with the Paris correspondent of the Times the kidnapping of Ion Perdicaris, and his stepson Varley, recently said: "Raisoul is a Moorish chief, an ex-governor of a province in the Sultan has forgotten to pay. He hopes by obtaining ransom for his prisoners to get financially square with his former master."

DR. ANNA E. PARK DEAD. Was First Woman Admitted to Medical Practice in New York. New York, May 31.—Dr. Anna E. Park, said to have been the first woman admitted to medical practice in New York, is dead at the age of 74. Three weeks ago, when in perfect health, devoting herself to the care of a number of charity patients whom she had attended ever since her practical retirement several years ago, she visited an undertaking establishment and told the manager she wished to arrange for her funeral.

DAVID R. FRASER DEAD. He Was One of the Founders of The Allis-Chalmers Company. Chicago, May 31.—David R. Fraser, one of the founders of what is now the Allis-Chalmers company, and identified with the concern until 1893, is dead of apoplexy. He was 80 years old. Mr. Fraser was the inventor of machinery which almost revolutionized the mining industry, and amassed a fortune in its manufacture.

A JAPANESE FAILURE. Another Attempt to Block Port Arthur Entrance Unsuccessful. Mukden, May 31.—The Japanese on the night of May 28 made another attempt to block Port Arthur by sinking merchant vessels in the harbor entrance. The attempt was discovered through the operations of a searchlight and one Japanese gunboat and two torpedo boat destroyers were sunk. The merchantmen then retired.

ON ALI'S TRAIL. Wood's Punitive Expedition Pursuing Murdering Moros. Manila, P. I., May 31.—Maj.-Gen. Wood has returned from Zamboanga, Island of Mindanao, where he has been organizing a punitive expedition dispatched in pursuit of the datus Ali and his band of Moros from the Rio Grande who on the 12th inst. surprised and massacred 53 Filipinos, men, women and children, employees of the government at Camp Oyarzun. United States troops are now trailing Ali, determined to either capture or destroy him and his followers.

STONED TO DEATH. Hiram Staley of Anderson, Ind., Killed by Unknown Parties. Chicago, May 31.—A dispatch to the Record-Herald from Anderson, Ind., says: "Hiram Staley, a young business man has been stoned to death just after stepping from an electric car at Chesterville, five miles east of here. His assailants have not been identified and their motive is not known."

CHINESE BANDITS. Seventy at Liao Yang Awaiting Execution. Liao Yang, May 31.—Seventy condemned Chinese bandits are here awaiting execution. The local Chinese governor, in view of the troublesome times has been empowered to behead bandits without referring their case to the Chinese authorities.

FOUR PLUNGED INTO THEIR DEATH. Were Throwing Flowers Into the River in Memory of the Dead When Bridge Broke. OTHERS NARROWLY ESCAPED. Accident Occurred at Salida, Colo., And Was Witnessed by Thousands.

SERIOUS RACE RIOT IN PHILADELPHIA. Five Persons Badly Injured Before Police Arrived and Stopped The Trouble. WAS STARTED BY CHILDREN. Black and White Youngsters Began To Quarrel and Parents Took Sides.

Philadelphia, May 30.—A race riot between white and colored persons occurred at Thirtieth and Wharton streets late this afternoon, and before the police succeeded in quelling the disturbance five persons were seriously hurt and a score of others were more or less roughly handled. Those most seriously injured, who were taken to a hospital, are: Irene Mentex, aged 6 years; shot in the back. Jesse Waller (colored), 28 years; stabbed in the back. Robert McCollough, 30 years shot in the back. Lizette Langdon, 18 years; shot in left side.

Peter the Great Gulf Mined. Vladivostok, Monday, May 30.—It is believed from information received here that the Japanese have mined Peter the Great gulf (in which this town is situated) a task of easy accomplishment because of the recent heavy fogs. One small Korean sailing vessel was blown up yesterday. The reason is quite so far as military operations are concerned.

DEATH TO BOLL WEEVILS. Red Ants Kill All in a Vast Texas Cotton Field. Fort Worth, Texas, May 31.—A special to the Record from San Antonio, Texas, says: Jose Cassiano, ex-county collector, who has several hundred acres of cotton in this county, is the head of the great ridings concerning the work of red ants. Mr. Cassiano's fields less than a month ago were alive with boll weevils. Today he said that there was not a live weevil in his fields.

Chinese Refugees from Dalny. Chefoo, May 31 (2:45 p. m.).—One hundred Chinese refugees arrived here from Dalny and Taitowan. While their statements differ in many respects regarding existing conditions on the Liao Tung peninsula, the majority agree upon the point that the Russians had left both places before the junks sailed on the 24th inst. Upon evacuation by the Russians, bandits attacked both towns and commenced burning and pillaging. The Japanese arrived later and took steps to protect the Chinese merchants. One Russian official was killed by the bandits. The Japanese troops captured the naval junks taken from Port Arthur to Nan Shan hill.

Gen. Ma's Troops Reviewed. New York, May 31.—A review of Gen. Ma's troops has taken place at Ping Chung, says a Herald dispatch from Peking. There were 3,000 infantry, 5,000 cavalry, 20 light mounted guns and four 3-inch Krupp guns. The infantry is fair.
