#### OBITUARY.

It becomes my duty to record the departure from this life of an early advocate of the gospel in his native land, in the person of DAVID R. LEWIS, the son of Robert R. Lewis, born April 12th, 1826, near Bedwellty Church, Monmouthshire. Brother Lewis embraced the gospel when but a boy of seventeen, received the ordination of a Priest at his first meeting and was, in a few weeks, ordained an Elder and sent forth to preach the gospel of glad tidings to his fellow creatures, which calling he filled and kept up with honor to himself and the cause he represented, until the
