EDWARD M. MOFFETT DEAD.

All His Life Claimed to be Rightful King of England.

New York, June 14.—The body of Ed-mund Montgomery Moffett, who all his life claimed to be the rightful king of England, was burled yesterday near his home at Woodcliffe, N. J. Dr. Moffett, who was 62 years old, was born of a good family in Chicinnati and for many years had a large medical practise in this city from which he accumulated quite a fortune. He and his immediate ancestors had traced their genealogy back to 400 B. C. and Dr. Moffett claims to be the true lineal descendant of King James 11.
