THE VOLUNTEER RETIRED LIST

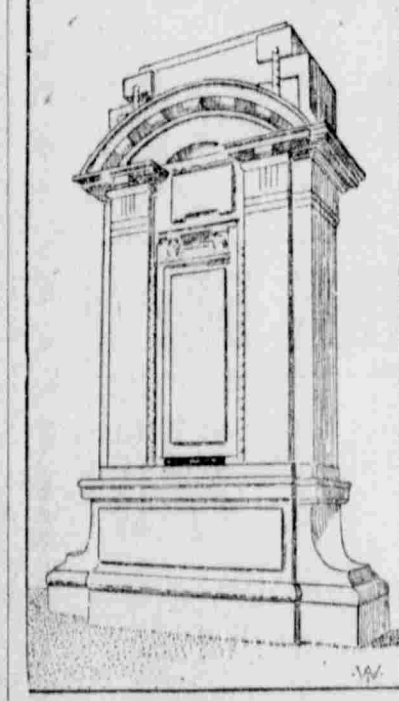
The effort to secure favorable action on a bill making a retired list for the volunteer officers of the Civil war who held the rank of or were brevetted brigadier generals has not met with any great success.

Why the President Accepted The Allison Amendment.

Senator Aldrich Declared: "They Never Had a Majority"—Referred to An Alleged Combination.

Washington, May 18.—Explanation as to why President Roosevelt discontinued negotiations with the Democrats and a portion of the Republicans and finally secured an agreement with all the Republicans on the railroad rate bill is found in the following sentence uttered by Senator Aldrich:

"They never had a majority." He referred to the combination between the Democrats and a faction of his own party. As to whether this statement is warranted by the conditions which existed at the time of the break from the Hepburn bill and the introduction of the Allison amendments is something that never will be known.
