Forty-Fifth Congress.

WASHINGTON, 18.—Beck called

upon the bill introduced by him on

the 15th, repealing sections of the

Revised Statutes, presenting addi-

tional causes of disqualification

and the challenge of an additional

oath for grand and petit jurors.

Pending discussion on the bill to

amend the statutes in relation to

patents, the Senate went into exe-

cutive session, and when the doors

re-opened, Harris called upon the

House for a resolution appropriat-

ing \$50,000 for the purpose of pay-

ing the necessary expenses incurred

by the committee of the Senate

and House in the investigation of

the cause and prevention of epi-

demic diseases. Passed.

Paddock called upon the bill re-

ported from the committee on

military affairs to amend the

confiscation clause of the army ap-

propriation bill for the present

fiscal year, so as to provide that

any part of the army shall not

be engaged in the protection of

life and property in states and ter-

ritories subject to Indian insur-

rection.

The amendments were agreed to

The Eastern Homeless

LONDON, 18.—A correspondent at
