that an application of the Adjutant-General of a State be authorized to issue, in moderate quantities, such tablets as may be indicated as desirable for the use of State troops, especially during the summer encampment. Upon the subject of military education, the General says: I do not think the introduction of an early and systematic introduction of the youth of the country to military studies and habits can be over-estimated. The course of instruction should not interfere with the schooling of an early age, prevent them from entering the life for which they are preparing themselves. It, however, leads them to affiliate in after life with the militia of their respective States, and to the National Guard, and members of such organizations, and increases measurably the capacity of the State's national guards to furnish military officers to the country in its hour of need.

Gov. In their zeal for the government policy the authorities of the military academy heretofore have gone far in forcing personal associations between white and black cadets without regard to prejudice, especially at mess table, and the military academy cannot, without utterly destroying its purpose, be made a nursery for delicate house-lions. Its use is to develop the fibre of those of more sturdy growth, and reject all who do not possess the requisite sturdiness.

Unless the African race is naturally superior to the Caucasian, and slavery a better school for race developments than freedom, it cannot be hoped that many colored boys will succeed where two-thirds of all the white boys now selected habitually fail. General Schofield recommends the retirement of color in the army in all its grades, and advises, more care in appointments, for most of the colored men appointed cannot nearly pass examination.

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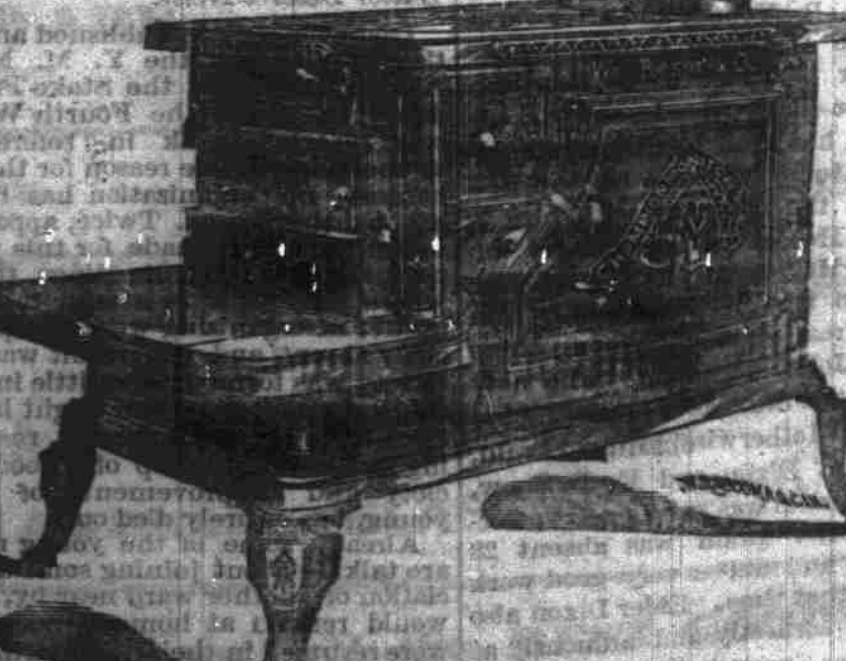
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
