Editor Deseret News:

Last Saturday and Sunday, the 14th and 15th inst., a two days' meeting was held at this place. It was largely attended by the home missionaries of this county and was presided over by President A. O. Smoot, of this stake of Zion. The addresses given by the brethren were mainly practical in their character, tending to instruct the people how to combine their labor and capital so as to build up and sustain the Zion of God on the earth. It was plainly shown that theory must be reduced to practice before any great good can be accomplished, and that we as a people must not only preach Zion, but that we must go to work and, out of the rude elements which God has provided, actually build up Zion: that if we have temples, beautiful cities, factories, railroads, canals, &c., we must build them, and in order to accomplish so stupendous a work as that required at our hands, we must co-operate on a much broader scale than hitherto.

Much excellent instruction was also given on the subject of education. The necessity of employing thoroughly competent teachers for our day schools and all interesting ourselves in the Sabbath schools, that our children may be trained in the knowledge that is contained in good books, in the wisdom that comes from God, and in the principles of revealed religion, were felt to be subjects of prime importance to the Saints, and as such were dwelt upon with a degree of earnestness that it is hoped carried conviction to every heart. Other subjects equally important were laid before the people.
