NEW YORK.
England makes a proposition to Spain and Cuba.

NEW YORK, 14.—The Sun says: We learn from unquestionable authority that a proposition of the following nature has been made by the British government to the representatives in London of the Cuban Republic. England is willing to guarantee to Spain the sum of one hundred million dollars for the cession of the island to the Cuban Republic, to bind herself not to annex the island to the United States for one hundred years from the date of her independence. The control of the Cuban custom houses will be given by Cuba to England as security for the loan until the latter be repaid; and, lastly, Cuba to be willing, if the powers possessing the other West India Islands consent thereto, to form one of a confederacy consisting of all the islands.

ILLINOIS.

CHICAGO, 14.—Thomas Diegnaw, an Irishman, nearly seventy years old, yesterday beat his divorced wife over the head with a hammer, inflicting fatal injury. The crop reports are still most encouraging from all parts of the west.

GALVESTON, 14.—There was another storm yesterday at 10 A.M., which caused much property loss, and destroyed the city and shipping. St. Patrick's church was blown down, and is a total ruin.

CALIFORNIA.
San Francisco, 14.—Ships are extremely firm to-day and sales very heavy, over \$300,000.

FOREIGN NEWS.

GREAT BRITAIN.

London, 14.—Reichardt is seriously ill, and his trial is postponed. The Times, in its editorial, says the U. S. also made concessions. It is unprecedented that such a grave difference is settled without any war. It is hoped Europe will rise to a higher conception of international fellowship.

The Telegraph says De Grey is created Marquis of Ripon in consequence of his distinguished service connected with the Treaty of Washington. The Standard says twenty-one men were executed yesterday in the Bois de Boulogne.

MEXICO.

The American Consul at the City of Mexico says a strong rebel position in the district has been taken by the government forces. The bombardment of Tampico continues. The rebels have inspired great terror by their fire, and have killed the government batteries.

CANADA.

Quebec, 14.—Hon. H. L. Tanguay, Secretary of State for Canada, in a public address here to-day, alluded to the Treaty of Washington, and stated the Canadian government had vigorously protested to the home government against the clause concerning the fisheries.

PORTUGAL.

Lisbon, 13.—Rio Janeiro dates to May 23rd state that Desque de Caxias has, on the part of the Brazilian government, presented to the Imperial Chamber an elaborate and carefully prepared address for the emancipation of all slaves belonging to the crown.

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CHANG TAY, who killed a fellow countryman at a cigar factory on Sacramento Street, on Monday night, was examined this morning and held for trial at the County Court on the charge of murder.
