## DIED.

At West Jordan, January 16th, 1879, ABIGAIL BRADFORD, wife of Bishop A. Gardner, aged 66 years and 4 months. Sister Gardner joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, at an early day in its history, and shared in the persecutions of her people, always evincing a strong and unshaken faith in the work. She leaves a number of relatives and friends.—COM.

In the 7th ward of this city, January 29, 1879, of old age, EZRA OAKLEY, born in King's County, Long Island, N. Y., April 10, 1778.

In Deseret City, at the residence of her son, January 24th, 1879, of dropsy, Mrs. ANN LAMBERT, aged 67 years and 1 month. She was beloved by all who knew her.

In the 16th Ward of this city, at 10 35, a.m. on Feb. 1, 1879, of paralysis and general debility, DIMICK BAKER HUNTINGTON; born May 26, 1808, at Watertown, Jefferson County, New York; baptized into the Church, September 1, 1835; and arrived in Utah, July 28, 1847.

In this city on the 28th inst., in the 85th year of her age, RUTH BALS, formerly of South Wales. She embraced the gospel in Tredegar, Monmouthshire, about 30 years ago; emigrated to Utah in 1855, was a resident of this city from that time up to the day of her death. She was well and favorably known as an honest and industrious woman, and although a widow for 36 years, by her thrift and economy sustained herself and aided a number of her children to emigrate after her. She lived and died an exemplary Latter-day Saint. Funeral services at the 15th ward school house, on Sunday at 1 p.m. Friends of the family are invited.

At Panguitch, Iron Co., U. T., Jan. 10th, 1879, of general debility, after a severe illness of three months, SUSAN EMELINE DAMERON, wife of J. D. Dyer. Deceased was born in Tennessee, August 26th, 1833. Emigrated to Utah in 1857. Those who visited her in her last hours felt assured that she died in full faith of the gospel. She leaves a husband and six children to mourn her loss. [COM.]

At his residence, in Pleasant Grove, Utah County, January 18th, 1879, of pneumonia, CHARLES STEWART, aged 64 years and 8 months.

Deceased was born in Lewis County, New York, May 14th, 1814; embraced the gospel and was baptized December 1841, with his family; gathered with the Saints at Nauvoo in the fall of 1843; was ordained into the Sixth Quorum of Seventies in the spring of 1845; he labored with others to build a house unto the name of the Lord; received his blessings in the Temple; was driven from Nauvoo in 1846; passing through the hardships of the journey through the American wilds, arrived in Salt Lake City, October 1st, 1852, soon after settling in Pleasant Grove; returned on a mission to his native State in the fall of 1859; received and obeyed every principle of the gospel revealed to the Latter-day Saints. He was universally beloved for his amiable disposition and sterling integrity. He leaves a large family to mourn his loss.
