

**THE "ETERNAL CITY."**

**Shaken In Its Foundations by the Explosion of an Immense Powder Magazine.**

**RUMORED ALLIANCE BETWEEN ENGLAND AND ITALY.**

**Russian Jews Excluded from Moscow As Imperial Decree to be Carried out.**

**A TERRIBLE EXPLOSION.**

**The City of Rome is the Scene of Wild Confusion.**

**Rome, April 22.—** About 7 o'clock this morning a tremendous explosion shook the city to its foundations, spreading terror and consternation throughout the land. People rushed affrighted from their houses into the streets. The houses rocked, and pictures fell from the walls. Thousands of pieces of glass were scattered and furniture overturned. Chimneys tumbled down upon the roofs, and in some instances toppled over into the streets below. The explosion was at first thought to be immediately after the explosion shock violently, and then collapsed with a crash, which added still further to the confusion. The explosion took place in the street leading to the house in which after this fearful explosion, have, however, never before been equaled during the history of modern Rome. All the thoroughfares were filled with people, who, with splinters and other debris, buried them by the force of the powerful concussion. Houses, doors, windows and cupboards were broken, and the debris lay in great piles against the walls, plaster fell from the ceiling, and general desolation prevailed. In many instances people were thrown from their beds, and the shrieks and cries of terror filled the air as thousands of families rushed out into the streets—parents with their children in their arms and children leaving their aged parents. The young men, who had been at work in the streets for the streets, as if their only chance of safety depended upon their being able to reach the open air. The general opinion is that a mine had been exploded by an earthquake shock, and that a second shock might reduce the city to ruins. Many fell on their knees and prayed aloud. Finally when someone like an order was received, the real cause of the explosion became known. It was discovered that the immense powder magazine at Pianaccio, which had been built here, had exploded; and that it had caused an enormous damage to the neighboring fort, which was filled with soldiers.

**THE BRITISH OF THE AFFAIR.**  
which have reached here, are that, happily, an officer in command of the fort heard a rumbling sound previous to the explosion, and, fearing an attack, ordered his soldiers to leave the fort. He succeeded in avoiding a terrible disaster. As it was, several priests who were in the vicinity at the time of the explosion were killed outright, a number of others were maimed or injured. At this instant a sentry King Humbert and the military who accompanied him, the Jansenists, and the Marquis of Rudini, and all the members of the Italian cabinet left this city for the scene of disaster. Among the ranks of the Jansenists, who had come to form a guard of honor, was drawn, in order to keep back the crowds of people who, now that the cause of the explosion is known, have flock to Plaza Pandolfi.

**All HOUSES**  
within a radius of one kilometer of the scene of explosion are seriously damaged. The exact number of killed and wounded is unknown at present. There are about 100 persons wounded and fully 150 civilians have been taken to different hospitals, suffering from wounds or bruises caused by the explosion. King Humbert used his influence to get the most severely wounded people to the hospital. The faces were to have been run off the afternoon previous to the explosion, according to reports of the Roman press. The seat of the explosion was felt, and several famous historical stained glass windows in the old buildings were shattered.

**Another report says that five people were killed, in addition to the large number of wounded already mentioned, and that houses were reduced to ruins by the explosion. The magazine contained 250 tons of powder. The cause of the explosion is unknown.**

**A Battle With Negro Antecedents.**
