## DIED.

**TENNEY**—At the residence of President George Q. Cannon, at 1:40 p.m. Thursday, April 12th, 1883, of old age, Eliza Tenney, daughter of James Webb and Betsey Paville and relict of the late Elder Wm. Tenney, aged 79 years. She was born November 17th, 1803, at Brookfield, Chenango County, New York. She married Wm. Tenney January 19th, 1830, and with him and her oldest daughter was baptized by Elder Truman Walt into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Sept. 1834. She and family moved to Kirtland, Ohio, November, 1835, and they contributed both means and labor towards the erection of the Temple at that place, and were present at its dedication. In 1838 they went to Missouri, and settled near Adam-on-di-Ahman; but were compelled by mob violence to abandon their newly-made home and flee to Far West, and afterwards with the rest of the Saints out of the State of Missouri, enduring all the hardships and exposure which the driven Saints had to suffer during that inclement season. Her family and herself settled at Quincy, where her husband died, Oct. 9th, 1844. When the Saints were driven from Nauvoo, in 1846, she went as far west as Winter Quarters; but after spending the winter there, was compelled, for want of means, to defer her journey to these valleys. She returned to Quincy, and in 1850 she and her children came here, and settled in Payson. For the past fifteen years she has lived with her daughter in this city. She has been a humble, faithful, God-fearing, peace-making woman, living the life of a true Saint, and has won the respect and love of all who have known her.

**CLARK**—In the 17th Ward of this city, on Thursday, April 12th, of pneumonia, George Clark, aged 29 years.

**POPE**—In the 2nd ward of this city, April 13th, 1883, of cholera infantum, Edith Maria, daughter of George and Jane Pope, aged 7 months.

**NIELSEN**—In Washington City, Washington County, of general debility, April 9th, 1883, Peter Nielsen, born February 23d, 1813, at Krulstrup, Jutland, Denmark; baptized March 3d, 1833; emigrated 1854. Was called at the October Conference, 1879, to perform a mission to his native land, to which he readily responded. He filled various positions of trust and responsibility. He was Counselor to Bishop Marcus Funk. Was called to Utah in 1881, and has labored faithfully from that time to the present to develop and advance the interests of this southern portion of our Territory. He was a man of industrious and exemplary habits, and unflinching integrity to the great latter-day work; was respected and esteemed by those who knew him, for his many good qualities. His last moments were spent in peace and serenity, inspired with faith and hope with regard to the reward of the faithful.—Com. Scandinavian Star, please copy.

**EVARTS**—At Oak City, Millard County, Utah, March 12th, 1883, of pneumonia, after an illness of ten days, Charity Everts, better known in the Territory as Charity Prows.

Deceased was born in Westford, Vermont, March 19th, 1811, and was the daughter of Thomas and Betsey Armes. She and her husband-Joshua Everts embraced the Gospel at an early day in Upper Canada.

In 1839, they started for Nauvoo, but he died and she was left a widow with two children, on the road, and had to work her way to Nauvoo the best she could.

In 1842, she married Thomas Prows, a widower, with a family of eight children. In the spring of 1846 she started with the Church to Winter Quarters with her four children, her husband apostatized and stayed behind. In 1850 she fitted out an oxteam and drove it herself across the plains. On her arrival at Salt Lake City she sold her team and wagon and bought a place in the 10th Ward.

In 1852, she moved to Fillmore, Millard County, and resided in the County up to the time of her death. She was the mother of 10 children, (four of whom are living) grand mother of 22 and great grand mother of 6. She died as she had lived, in full faith of the Gospel.—Com.
