Instruments sold at \$500 cost but \$210, and those sold for \$1,000, which are handsome carved grands, cost but \$775. (You get what enormous profits are made on them. Pianos range from \$50 to \$3,000, and some styles, with an extra molding, which costs but \$5, they ask \$50 more for. They argue that it looks \$100 better. There are dealers in New York that buy pianos of companies and large manufacturers for from \$25 to \$30, and sell for \$350 and \$700."

'If it is as bad as that, what do you do?'  
'Only five cents a glass and the water thrown in.'  
'Any taste for music?'  
'Strong. Dues and banks in the day time, roll bowling and card nights at night, piano and orchestra at times, and any kind of music you want.'  
'Any plaid or tartan?'  
'No, but we have several cow bells and a tin pan in every family.'  
'What kind of a family in moderate circumstances do for a living?'  
'Work, shave, wash, scrub, hunt, steal, or if pinched, buy and sell town property.'
