

ASSUMED RUSSIAN FLEET INVINCIBLE

Gen. Kurapatkin Testified Plan of War With Japan Was Based on That Theory.

EXTERMINATING PLAGUE.

Only Three Verified Case So Far This Month in San Francisco.

San Francisco, Dec. 12.—Only three verified cases of plague have occurred so far this month, and the sanitary campaign that is being waged for the eradication of the disease by the marine hospital service corps under the direction of Dr. Henshaw is proving effective.


