

GRIFFIN IS TAKEN.

The Runaway Convicts are Gradually Returning to the "Pen."

The Authorities Hope That the Whole of the Escaped Men Will Be Shortly Captured.

They are coming back one by one. Another of the batch of convicts who got away from the Utah penitentiary last Sunday has been recaptured and returned to himself. The individual in question is Thomas Griffin, his captor was Sheriff Oliver Wood of Davis county, and he was secured at Farmington about four o'clock yesterday afternoon. Griffin has a lame walk upon his left arm and this is what led to his identity. At first he pretended that the Sheriff had made a mistake in supposing him to be a convict, but when it was found that his gun was ready up he confessed the truth. In point of reality Griffin ranks second to Hillard, the career mover of the scheme which was put into force last Sunday morning.

When Sheriff Wood and his men arrived at Farmington and descended in this city at 2 a.m. last night they were "most certainly reassured" by Warden Young and Sheriff Burr, whom faces were radient with broad smiles, and said after Bill Griffin was made out to be the man he was wanted he was "surely safe." The authorities declared that he was glad to be "back again," as he felt nearly home up with wandering about since his day.

Griffin is now suffering from rheumatism a result of long in camp, passing several hours in riding, just after the "trick" escape. Yesterday morning he met a partner on the road near Farmington. The partner, having read a description of the runaway convicts in the newspaper, stopped him and asked him if he was Griffin. He declared that he was glad to be "back again," as he felt nearly home up with wandering about since his day.

James Griffin, is one of the most desperate characters in the country. He was sentenced to the Third District court June 2, 1893, for housebreaking—two years.
