BRIGHAM CITY, March 13, 1871. Editor Evening News:-Dear Sir .-The Brigham City woolen factory, on the banks of the Box Elder, is now running and doing fair work. The dimensions of the main building is 88 by 45, which contains three 48 inch carding machines, besides a double one and a picker, and one spinning jack with 200 spindles. It has four broad looms calculated to weave cloth 3 yards wide, also a complete set of cloth dressing machinery, and all necessary apparatus for dyeing, which is propelled by a turbine wheel 261 inches with 24 feet head, and is equal to a fifty horse power, perfectly able to run another set of machinery equal to what the building now contains, for which also plenty of room is yet left in the building. 116 lbs of warp was spun last Friday.




