Near Marlboro' Point, on the Potomac, a burial place of Indians of gigantic stature has recently been discovered.
Black bears are becoming numerous in the northern section of New Hampshire. In many places they have done great injury to the sheep.
A minister in Lee, Mass., preaches to a congregation averaging about five persons. Few rents must be high if assessed to pay the minister.

The Lisbon gold mines, in New Hampshire, are now worked seventy-one feet below the surface, the vein being twelve feet wide. Four days crushing recently amounted to about \$200.
To show its contempt for all projects for its capture, the lightning went into the gable of the house of a lightning-rod seller at Cleveland, and tore it to splinters, despite the nineteen rods which were intended to protect the building.
A Western editor, advertising for clubs for his paper, received a dozen or more hickory shells from friends in the backwoods. He stored them in his office, and found occasional employment for them when exasperated subscribers visited the establishment.
A poor lad was recently brought before the Lord Mayor of London, who asked him whence he came. "I'm Irish, your honor." "Have you ever been to sea?" "Well, that's good," replied Paddy. "Does your honor perhaps think that I came over in a wheelbarrow?"
The inhabitants of two villages near Acqui, Italy, having been on bad terms for some time, recently delegated ten champions each, in order to fight the matter out, who met well armed with pistols and knives. Before the police could separate them several were killed, one man having twenty-seven knife wounds.
The consumption of grapes in Paris is estimated at about 8,570 tons for the year 1898, besides those cultivated within the limits of which no return can be obtained. This year the quantity will probably exceed 10,000 tons, as the grapes are said to be remarkably good and sweet.
A speculator in Meriden, Ct., fearing a crisis some years ago, turned his property over to his wife, and she refused to give it up. Even now, after her death, by the provisions of her will he can only have the income of the property, and that only so long as he remains a widower, the property, in the case of his marriage, going to one of the churches of that place.
The Board of Health of Havre placed the ship which brought the collection of Indian scalps from Vera Cruz into quarantine, in order to prevent the shipping and town from infection. The ship emitted such an intolerable stench that it had to be fumigated outside the city before being delivered into the hands of the collectors who are to convert it into waterfalls and chignons!
A decree was recently published in Poland ordering all hack drivers to adopt the Russian costume. Accordingly, they all changed their dress, but what was their dismay on being fined two roubles each for not having changed their whips for the short-handled stock and long leather thong used in Russia.
The inhabitants of Tuxahuaco, District of Chalco, in Mexico, while quarrying recently, came suddenly upon a mysterious town, sepulchred amid volcanic lava, within which were found the houses and corpses of its former denizens, perfectly mummified. The volcano that produced this disaster must have completely disappeared at the time, burying beneath its ashes and lava all the ancient towns and occupants of its environs, whose existence is not mentioned in history.
A coachman in Brooklyn speaks of the section called Dublin, and says: "If you run over a youngster down there in the ward, the folks don't say 'nothing'—kase they have got more children than a wile for 'em—but you just run over a goat, or a cow, or a pig, and blast me if a mob ain't after you in two minutes."
Traveling in Norway is cheap. A traveler writes: "At some of the stations we were charged, for two persons, four marks (eighty cents in gold) for supper, bed and breakfast. A horse and cabriolet hired from station to station cost about thirty-eight cents in gold a Norwegian mile, which is seven English miles. On the steamers a man and his wife travel at a fare and a half."
