THAT PICTURESQUE POKE.

The poke bonnet has had a varied and a checkered career since the attempt was made to revive it some season or two ago. The style plotured is a development of the late summer, and while it strongly suggests accepted poke lines, still there are other features that bring it into closer connection with current fashions. The crown is of drum shape, and large all around, the brim narrows to nothing in the back and spreads gracefully at front and sides. A bandeau in the front gives the shape that very becoming tilt, which the deep dent right in the center of the front serves to emphasize. The straw is one of the slightly burnt shades of yellow, little white Scotch roses are strewn along the brim; and bunchy rosettes of pale blue velvet ribbon are posed either side of the front and right in the center of the back; and from this last the strings start, a further bunch of loops and ends being fastened under the left ear.
