BURDEN OF DEFICIT IS GREAT.

Ministry Gets its Revenge for Rejor tion by the House of Lords Of its Licensing Bill.

April 19.—Accumulates wealth and the trade which the lique justness is popularly called in the Liberal government's budget, which Davis Lloyd-George, chancellor of the exchequer presented in the house of con mons, today, are made to bear the bur den of the £3,763,600 (\$78,810,000) deficit of the fiscal year incurred by the oldage pensions and the race with Ger nany for Dreadpoughts.

"Socialism and confiscation," the wealthy classes are already crying and a few are clutching at the hope that the house of lords, which represents these classes may throw out the budget outliefly, but this is improbable. Increased income taxes, death estates and legacies, duties, a tax of 20 per cent on future increase in the value of lands due to the enterprise of the community, taxes on motors to be devoted to keeping up of the rauds, stamp taxes on sales of property are the proincipal levies upon wealth. s upon wealth.

The government gets its revenge for the rejection recently by the lords of its licensing bill by increasing the taxes on some classes of public houses and the customs excise duties on spirits. A fax of three pence in the pound on pales of liquors in clubs is also imposed and this is likely to antagonize both the liquor interests and the workingmen.

The new taxation bears heavily on corportations. The only features affecting the United States are the increase in the tobacco tax, a tax of three pence per gallon on petrol and heavier stamp duties on stock transactions.

The first comments of the members of both parties show astonishment at the number and the aweeping nature of the changes in the country's financial sys-

tem.

"The maddest budget ever introduced." Sir Frederick George Banbury
termed it during a speech in which he
declared that the new budget included
"every fad on the face of the earth."
Austin Chamberlain denounced it for
imposing a large portion of the nation's
burdens on a few people by different
devices.

John Redmond, leader of the Irish party, asserted that the witsky tax imposed another burden on Ireland which the Nationalists would resist by every means. The increase in the tax on tobacco, he declared, would be a cruel hardship to the poor of Ireland.
