### St. Mark's Hospital Selected by Sanitary Committee for Isolation.

The sanitary committee of the city council last evening decided to recomaend that the city join with the county in accepting the proposition submitted by St. Mark's hospital in the matter of estublishing an isolation hospital for diphtheria and scarlet fever cases. St. Mark's hospital agrees to erect a building and treat cases for \$2 per day, each, the city and county to pay a bonus of \$40 per month each for a
