FOUR HUNTERS ACCIDENTALLY KILLED

A Mailed Editor Dead—Was Stabbed

Seven Times—Caught by a

Railway Train.

An aged woman, whose name was not ascertained, was knocked down by a runaway team in San Francisco Monday afternoon and seriously injured. Her recovery is doubtful.

Maximilian O'Connell, a member of the board of directors of the University of California, died at Athens, Greece, Tuesday night. Prof. O'Connell was a member of the faculty of the university. He was associate professor of anatomy, and being young, vigorous and enthusiastic was placed in the position. Word has been received of a fatal gunning accident near Hollister, Cal., in which Arthur, a young man, is believed to have been killed and his brother Henry to have had his eye shot out. The boys were out hunting ducks, and while riding in a wagon a duck went off. Arthur was aged 12 years and Henry 16. No particulars have been received.

Rodney M. Cuthbertson, who was knocked down by a car at San Jose, Cal., on October 23rd, has sued the company for \$2000 alleged damages, and for \$7500 damages. He alleges that one leg is shorter than the other, that he has lost his eye, that he is unable to do his work, and that he is in great pain. He is now in the hospital, and his condition is reported to be serious.

The death of M. K. Flood of Los Angeles, Cal., Monday is believed to be a case of cholera. Flood was made to keep the story quiet, it is said, in the afternoon Flood sent for some relatives, and they were told that he was suffering from cholera. He was then taken to the hospital, where he died. It is said the hard times worked on his mind.

The remains of Joseph Griffin, proprietor of a well known saloon, were found at midnight Tuesday in a tearfully mangled condition on the main line of track in the city. The police are searching for the men who gave the names of C. J. Hamilton and Frank Shibley. They had a bloody knife and a silver watch with blood on it. The dollar was taken from Ortega.

A tragedy is reported from Bain City, the county seat of the new county of Big Horn, Wyoming, in which William Binkley lost his life at the hands of Alexander McDonald. The trouble grew out of a claim jumping, and had been continuing for some time. Binkley was shot and killed by McDonald, who was a well known claim jumper.
